A WORD FROM THE FOUNDERS

Challenges, regardless of whether they are big or small, are an integral part of each and every person's life. Unfortunately, not everyone has the same starting point, same opportunities and chances, or the power to overcome problems. Sometimes it is – enough to help people get started and take control of their lives. Others need more help, -assistance and continuous support.

For ten years now, the Foundation has been the supporting the most vulnerable families and individuals - facing existential issues and civil society organizations. In the past ten years we have collected \$ 13.5 million and helped more than 600,000 people. We have taken care of more than 700 families and supported 829 small family businesses and agricultural farms. We have renovated and equipped more than 90 public buildings: kindergartens, schools, sports facilities, hospitals, reception centers and asylum centers and supported 450 youth initiatives in Serbia. We have distributed around 14,000 packages of clothes to children's homes, schools and shelters across Serbia, and more than 2,000 of the most vulnerable families received - food and basic needs packages.

Summing up the ten-year results of our work has not only filled our hearts with joy, but also strongly motivated us to continue our work and make our society a better place to live in. Such results would certainly not have been achieved without the dedicated work and expertise of all the employees of the Foundation, or without our partners and donors who have had great confidence in us. Through our work we have met many honorable people who have through their selfless acts transformed the lives of those in greatest need. They have taken our breaths away, inspired and motivated us. For all of us in the Foundation - such people are the true elite of this society and we are proud to have them close to us.

As they say, life is all about little things, but major problems as well. The essence is, as our famous Dusko Radovic said: "Our little means a lot to those who have almost nothing".

Achieved results:

- a new asylum center in Tutin built
- two prefabricated buildings in Vranje built
- five barracks for accommodation of migrants in the Asylum Center in Krnjaca renovated
- reception center in Kikinda renovated

Since the very start of the migrant crisis, Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation has been involved in supporting refugees passing through Serbia on the “Balkan Route”. The closing of borders and an increasingly restrictive migrant policy in the surrounding countries have posed new challenges to the local communities on the Serbian part of the route. This was the main reason, in addition to assisting migrants, to continue to support local communities and residents in municipalities most affected by the migrant crisis. Assistance and support activities were implemented in cooperation with the Commissariat for Refugees. Expansion of accommodation capacities for temporary stay and improvement of quality of life in 2017 were the focus of Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation. In addition to the newly built asylum center in Tutin and two prefabricated buildings in Vranje, the reception center in Kikinda was also renovated and the facilities at the Asylum Center in Krnjaca were reconstructed. In this way, we provided more than 1,500 refugees with the roof over their head and dignified living conditions. The projects of extension of temporary stay accommodation facilities were implemented in cooperation with international organizations Catholic Relief Services (CRS) and UNHCR.





Haadla is one of the women who, escaping from poverty and war in Syria, stayed in the Preševo Reception Center. She came to Serbia in 2017 with her husband, believing that it was within reach of their desired destination in Western Europe. Speaking to employees of the Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation, Haadla said she was convinced that Syria would never go back to being what it once used to be, that they wanted to reach Germany and start a new life. Her stay in Serbia lasted for months, and in order to give her family a feeling of home, regardless of the difficult circumstances of life, she grew a small garden near the barracks inside the reception center. For Haadla and more than 4000 migrants, reception centers in Serbia are the only home they have for a long period of time. Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation, with partners and in cooperation with the Commissariat for Refugees and Migration and the Ministry of Labor, Employment, Veteran and Social Affairs, improved the conditions for accommodation of migrants, and through various forms of humanitarian aid and other services Haadla's family were provided a dignified stay in Serbia.



In addition to the expansion of accommodation capacities and provision of better conditions in reception and asylum centers, Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation, in cooperation with the International Rescue Committee (IRC), organized numerous activities for skills development and occupation activities. In the Reception center in Obrenovac and the Asylum Center in Krnjaca, IT, ecological, music, carpentry and creative workshops that gave a chance to migrants to develop different skills and spend quality time were organized within the project "Social Cafe". Also, during 2017, classes of English and Serbian language were organized for all age groups.

Achieved results:

- courses, workshops and various activities organized for 8,000 men, women and children
- more than 3,500 volunteer hours spent in the municipalities affected by the migrant crisis



Bagher from Afghanistan was staying in the asylum center in Krnjaca during 2017. He learned Serbian, so he shared his life story with the employees of Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation in Serbian. He wanted to stay in Serbia and find a job. He said that he came to Serbia on foot, from Afghanistan through Iran, Turkey and Greece. The wounds on his legs were the testimony of that. He said that Serbia should have been just one more stop on his way to a better life in Western Europe. However, upon arrival, he realized that he wanted to start building that better life in Serbia, because after thousands of kilometers, he encountered human goodness and true solidarity in Serbia. Learning Serbian is just one of Bagher's ways to show respect for people who reached a helping hand to him in the most difficult situation he had ever experienced.



During 2017, Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation carried out various activities in the Centers for asylum in Sjenica and Tutin. In cooperation with the Group 484 and the Royal Norwegian Embassy, a number of workshops for women and girls as well as sports activities and Serbian language classes were organized in Sjenica and Tutin. With the support of UNICEF, Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation organized additional activities in the child friendly space at the Asylum Center in Sjenica. Thanks to this partnership all children in the asylum center had regular recreational and educational activities and help in learning. In addition to sports activities, the children had the opportunity to learn Serbian language, mathematics and geography, but also to express their creativity in art workshops.

Achieved results:

- More than 130 children accommodated in the asylum center had access to activities in the child friendly space and received psychosocial support through the activities carried out by the educators.
- 150 creative workshops organized
- 100 different sports activities organized
- 110 Serbian language classes, 110 math classes and more than 110 geography classes held.





Direct humanitarian aid continued in 2017 and assistance was provided in the form of basic need packages, such as food, clothing, footwear and personal hygiene products. From the beginning of the migrant crisis, Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation recognized this type of assistance as one of the most important links in the chain of support, especially during first contact with the most vulnerable groups, so the foundation has been providing this type of assistance for years.

Achieved results:

- 10,000 migrants received direct humanitarian aid: food, personal hygiene, clothing and footwear.



Support was provided to local communities most affected by the migrant crisis. The project "Bolstering Emergency Municipal and Local Community Response to the Movement of refugees and Migrants throughout Serbia", provided financial support to seven municipalities most affected by the migrant crisis, through the support of the US Agency for International Cooperation (USAID): Lajkovac (Bogovođa), Šid, Sjenica, Tutin, Preševo, Subotica and Dimitrovgrad.

In these municipalities, Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation helped the local population through training and procurement of emergency equipment, donations to soup kitchens and community health centers. Also, more than 700 volunteer activities in which migrants and the local population jointly cleaned the environment and the space they all used were organized, which was an added value to the strengthening of the capacities of local communities that were affected by the migrant crisis and contributed to the strengthening of inclusion and the promotion of diversity.

Achieved results:

- equipment for emergency situations as well as the funds for soup kitchen and environment protection provided in the amount of USD 70,000 for the seven municipalities most affected by the migrant crisis
- Nine ECG devices donated to health care facilities across the country
- Seven elementary schools received the necessary equipment in the amount of 50,000 USD
- More than 700 volunteer activities organized in local communities affected by the migrant crisis

AID THAT CHANGES LIFE



During 2017, Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation continued to help refugees and internally displaced persons from former Yugoslavia, as well as socially vulnerable families. The Foundation strives to provide these social groups, which are increasingly exposed to the risk of poverty or are below the poverty line, with roofs over their heads, students' scholarships and other types of assistance, which is not just short-term support, but essentially changes the lives of those that need support the most. In this way, we help these families come out of the vicious cycle of poverty, overcome traumas from the past and become equal members of the society.

Through the humanitarian project "You Can Too" funds were collected for the housing care of refugees and internally displaced families. As a result of cooperation with the Airport "Nikola Tesla" Belgrade, the Jato Foundation and donations received from a large number of individuals, two refugee families from Kikinda and Vranje got new homes. Both families are single-mother families, which makes these mothers a particularly vulnerable category frequently exposed to discrimination, poverty and social exclusion.

Achieved results

- houses for two single-mother families purchased in Vranje and Kikinda



Radmila Drljača from Vranje is a single mother of four children. Because of hard life and poverty, Radmilla's idea of her own home had for a long time been just a dream she never believed would come true. Thanks to Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation and numerous donors, this single mother and her children now have a roof over their heads. They moved to their new home in December 2017, and Radmila thanked everyone who took part in fundraising that was organized even through the media. Now that she has the basic conditions for a dignified life, she can see a better future for her children.



Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation provided packages of food and personal hygiene products through activities aimed at collecting one-time assistance to the most vulnerable refugee families. During 2017, the packages were distributed to the poorest families from five cities: Belgrade, Novi Sad, Ruma, Stara Pazova and Šabac. Also, with the selfless support of the brotherhood of the Visoki Decani Monastery, the Foundation continued taking care of the poorest families from the territory of Kosovo and Metohija. Help in food, heating, household appliances, furniture and other living necessities was delivered to the most threatened families.

Achieved results:

- 500 packages of food and personal hygiene products for the most vulnerable families from Croatia provided.
- assistance in food, heating, household appliances and other home inventory for eight families from Kosovo and Metohija provided
- laptop computers for children from eight poor families from Kosovo and Metohija provided

As a part of the support to refugees and displaced persons, Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation, with the help of a large number of donors, provided scholarships for secondary school students in Serbia whose parents fled the territory of the Republic of Croatia. All scholarship holders were engaged in volunteer work during the school year 2017/2018 and thus gave everyone a true lesson in humanity, not only to younger generations, but also to older citizens who forgot that the greatest wealth in life is the art of giving.

Achieved results:

- 39 students' scholarships for children from refugee families granted



Milica Ivanis from Zrenjanin is one of the scholarship beneficiaries who got involved in humanitarian work by helping children living below the poverty line. She shared her impressions with Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation staff and emphasized that children's smiles and enthusiasm while receiving gift packages gave her new strength to continue making those who needed help the most happy. Milica told everyone that it's not the quantity of our giving that matters, but the love with which we give, because love can make even the smallest things big.



Ten years of field experience and numerous statistical indicators show that rural households in Serbia are increasingly exposed to poverty and social exclusion, while some regions remain particularly underdeveloped. One of these municipalities is Kuršumljija. Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation reconstructed a large number of houses in Kuršumlijska Banja for the most socially vulnerable families. The reconstruction included construction of toilets, repair of roofs, replacement of carpentry and electrical installations. As additional help for all people from Kuršumlijska Banja, food packages, children's New Year's packages, free of charge internet access and free intercity transport were provided as well.

Achieved results:

- 13 houses for the socially vulnerable rural families reconstructed in Kuršumlijska Banja
- Food packages for all the residents of Kuršumlijska Banja provided
- New Year's packages for children provided
- Free internet for residents of Kuršumlijska Banja provided
- Free transportation from village to town provided once a week



SUPPORT TO SINGLE - PARENT FAMILIES



Within the provision of one-time humanitarian aid, Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation did not forget single-parent families recognized as a category increasingly exposed to poverty and social exclusion. Several thousand single-parent families received food packages within the campaign that the Foundation implemented in cooperation with Public utility company "Infostan".

Achieved results:

- 2 million RSD raised for 550 food packages for 5,016 single-parent families

DECENT LIFE FOR ALL



Unfortunately, in Serbia a large number of people live on the verge of poverty, and they cannot afford everyday necessities such as clothing and footwear. During 2017, Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation, with the support of Inditex, organized a campaign to distribute new clothes and shoes to the socially vulnerable population in the territory of Serbia, entitled "Clothes for All". In order to cover the territory of the whole country, the project was implemented with the support of local partners and more than 1000 volunteers. As many as 36 institutions and organizations across the country participated in the successful completion of the project.

Achieved results:

- 13,850 packages of clothes and footwear for 11,000 users provided

AGRICULTURE - A STAKE FOR THE FUTURE



Djurdjevic, the family of seven, with three minor children from the village Blizonje, received the pump and hose to bring water from the water source to the house and barn. After their old well dried out, they brought water for household purposes by tanks. The only source of income for this multi-member family is agriculture, and the basic income is earned by selling milk from seven cows. All members of the family love animals, and they take care of three horses, rabbits, sheep and poultry. Provision of water supply to the family will bring both financial savings and easier everyday life.

Investing in agriculture does not benefit only those engaged in agriculture. It is an investment in the society as a whole. In 2017, Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation continued supporting the development of agriculture, focusing on young farmers, in order to economically empower families who wanted to stay and live in villages. Divac agricultural funds aimed at the development of agriculture in rural areas, 105 farming households with 517 members set up and developed their own businesses or agricultural productions. Domestic animals (goats, sheep and other domestic animals), agricultural machinery and building materials worth USD 135,000 were donated. Cooperation was established with six municipalities in Serbia: Užice, Požega, Knjazevac, Prijepolje, Valjevo and Vladičin Han.

Achieved results:

- 53 families provided with herds of domestic animals
- 52 families received agricultural machinery and required equipment



THE FUTURE LIES IN GOOD IDEAS

Innovative ideas are today's most wanted products, as well as the first step towards developing one's own business that will bring a better life for many members of the community in the future. The aim of Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation is to contribute to the development of corporate social responsibility and to encourage innovative ideas in the field of social entrepreneurship. For the past three years, the Foundation has implemented the project "The Idea for a Better Tomorrow" in partnership with UniCredit Foundation, UniCredit Bank and Smart Kolektiv. As a part of the project, there was a public call for social enterprises that generate revenues from the production and sale of goods and the provision of services which have a social goal, to apply and get funds. Also, companies that reinvest some of their profits into achieving their social goal, small cooperatives, citizens' associations, limited liability companies, craft workshops and others were also allowed to apply. The funds in the amount of EUR 40,000 were allocated to the following finalists: Initiative for Social Empowerment, Citizens' Association for Combating Trafficking in Human Beings and all forms of gender – based violence "Atina", the Citizens' Association "Vunena", Association Supporting People with Developmental Disabilities "Naša kuća", association supporting people with psycho-physical disorders "Zajedno", the Social agricultural cooperative "Nova Perspektiva", the Association of citizens "Liceulice" and the Social Entrepreneurship Initiative "Chrono.rs".

Achieved results:

- Seven social enterprises received funds for the development of social entrepreneurship in the total amount of EUR 40,000.

"For Vunena the project "The Idea for a Better Tomorrow" was of great importance because it helped them make international contacts and enabled the placement of their products on the foreign market. Apart from that, the mentoring program was a very interesting experience through which we made contact with new suppliers and other interesting individuals, but the cooperation with mentors is what most improved our internal organization and the way of doing business."

Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation, in partnership with the Center for Dignified Work started the project "Strengthening of gender equality and position of single mothers on the labor market in Serbia", at the end of 2017. The project will be implemented by May 2019 across Serbia, with financial support from the European Union within the programme "The European Instrument for Democracy and Human Rights" (EIDHR).

Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation and the German development cooperation project "Promotion of Youth Employment" implemented by the German Corporation for International Cooperation (GIZ) under the joint project "Empowering young entrepreneurs in the field of agriculture" announced the 2017 call for grants for young farmers. This project will be implemented by November 2018.

YOUNG PEOPLE CHANGE THE WORLD

Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation continued its work on the project “Divac Youth Funds”, which has been implemented since 2013, aimed at contributing to the participation of young people in local development processes through granting of projects initiated and run by the young people. Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation implemented the Project “Divac Youth Funds” in cooperation with the organization Proaktiv from Nis, Association “Ja sam za” from Arandjelovac, “Nova Vizija” from Prijepolje, the Obrenovac Youth Foundaton and Veles Association from Vladicin Han, with the support of the Balkan Trust for Democracy and Booking.com. The project “Youth Bank Hub for Western Balkans and Turkey” which, apart from Serbia, gathers organizations from Macedonia, Albania, Montenegro and Turkey, aims to encourage the participation of young people in public life on the local and national levels. The common denominator of these countries is not only that they all have candidate status for the EU membership, but also face similar challenges when it comes to youth participation in decision-making in all spheres of life. The Network has developed the Youth Participation Index on the basis of which it collects data and measures the degree of involvement of young people in the economic, political and social sphere. This monitoring instrument for young people has been developed for the first time in Europe, and the project is being implemented with the financial support of the European Commission.

Achieved results:

- 58 youth projects supported with USD 40,000.
- Capacities of five local organizations developed



Tamara Radulović from the group “Blueta” implemented the project “Blueta Festival of puppet shows” with three teachers, several high school students and one graduate student from Stojnik. Tamara emphasized that some of the project’s implementers had already participated in the Divac Youth Fund call and that this experience was very important for them. That is why in 2017 they applied again.

THE CHANCE LIES IN EDUCATION



Improvement of conditions for the upbringing and education of children and youth and support to youth projects is an area that Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation have been investing in for years. During the past year, 17 schools and kindergartens, which are used daily by more than 9,000 children, have been renovated and equipped through various projects.

Achieved results:

- 17 facilities for children reconstructed and equipped
- 1,000 New year's packages for children provided in schools throughout Serbia

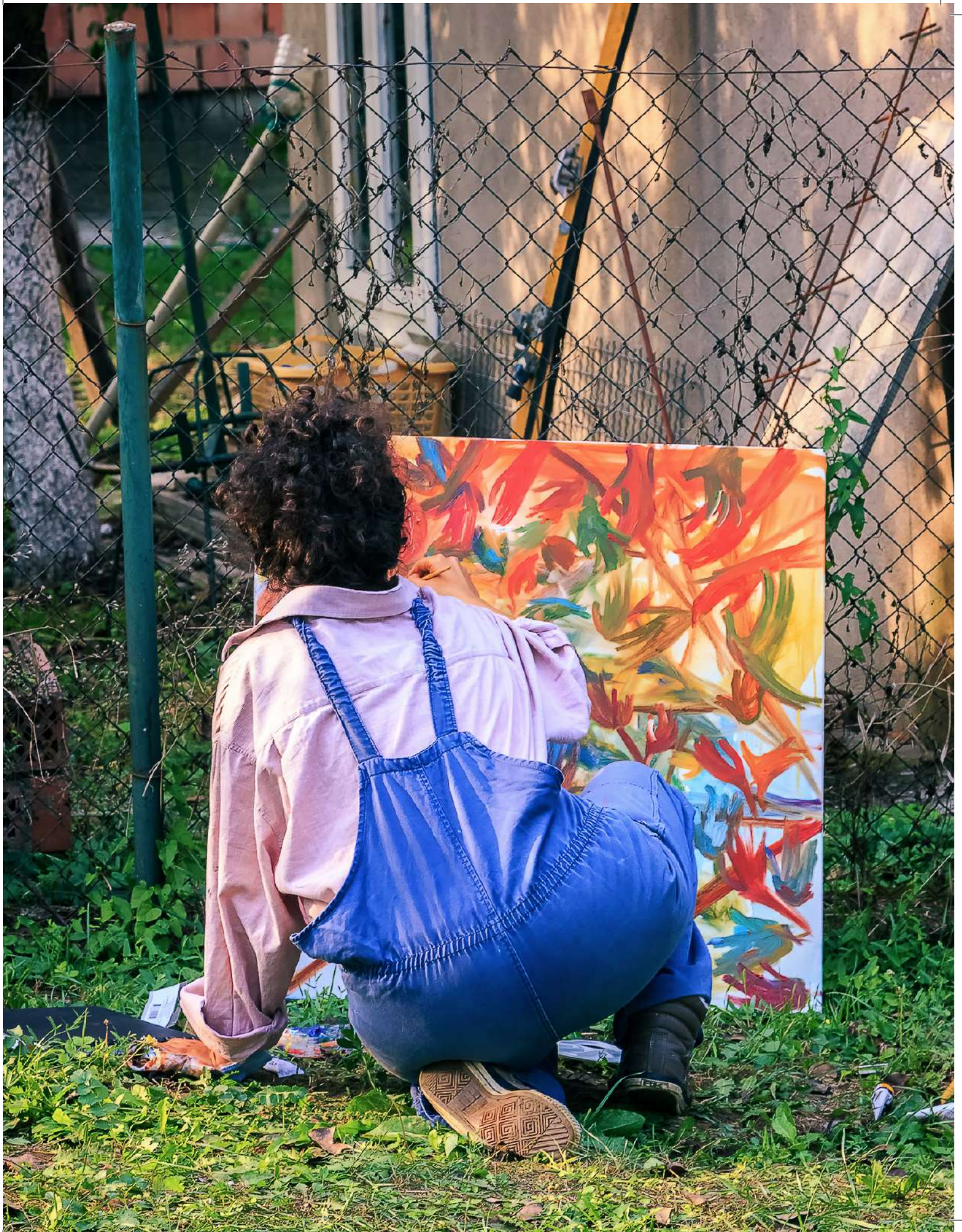

Having in mind the decades-old problem of a dramatic decrease in the population and decreasing birth rates in Serbia, Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation, with financial support from individual donors Vladimir Ivanovic from the USA for the third consecutive year, implemented the project "Babies are In". The municipality in which the project was implemented is Vladičin Han. During 2017, a new two-year support cycle for families selected in a public call according to predefined criteria was initiated. Twelve families who have joined the program, will receive regular monthly financial support, as well as regular help of a nurse from October 2016 to October 2018.

Achieved results:

- 12 families received support in the amount of USD 70 per month





HELP ON THE ROUTE

The project “Help on the route - Fostering protection of human rights of migrants passing through Macedonia and Serbia” is implemented by Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation in partnership with Arbeiter-Samariter-Bund Deutschland (ASB), Novi Sad Humanitarian Center and the Helsinki Committee for Human Rights of Macedonia. The aim of the project is to contribute to the promotion and protection of human rights of migrants and asylum seekers passing through Macedonia and Serbia. Through the project, 20 civil society organizations from both countries have received financial support in the total amount of 300,000 EUR in order to strengthen their capacities to identify, document and report violations of human rights of migrants and asylum seekers. The project is funded by the European Union within the program of the European Instrument for Democracy and Human Rights (EIDHR) program.

With the support of the Open Society Foundations, Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation started the project “Support to Local Communities Affected by High Transit Migration in Serbia” at the end of 2017. The project was implemented in the municipalities of Preševo, Subotica and Šid until October 2018.

A minor K.M. from Afghanistan was surprised by the fact that during PE classes he could play football with other children. He told employees of Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation that he thought that he should be sitting on the side because everyone was afraid of him. Through social withdrawal, he tried to avoid “the punishment” because he was different from other children. When he realized that schoolmates accepted him, he looked forward to going to school. A good inclusive practice was confirmed by S.L., a student from Vranje, who pointed out that the fact that they did not know the language the migrants spoke, did not mean that they could not play nicely and be friends.

CELEBRATING SOLIDARITY



Since its establishment, Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation has been dedicated to the development of philanthropy and the improvement of the culture of giving. The project “Celebrating solidarity” recalled numerous examples of philanthropy in our society that encouraged citizens to express solidarity, providing them with a variety of free programs adapted to different generations and interests. A large number of activities were marked by a jubilee - the 10th anniversary of Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation, which on a daily basis promotes solidarity as a universal human value. It was these activities that encouraged the media to report more on the importance of solidarity and the culture of giving in our society, and as a result philanthropic media infrastructure was strengthened throughout the region and the arising content was published on the website www.museumofsolidarity.eu.

The focus of the activities gathered around the idea of improving the culture of giving was at the “Solidarity Festival” , was to raise awareness of the universal values of philanthropy, but also to motivate individuals to change their surroundings and become responsible members of the society.

Achieved results:

- 30 events organized aimed at developing philanthropy in 10 cities in Serbia
- 10,000 citizens participated in the “Solidarity Festival”
- 100,000 people saw the campaign “Celebrating solidarity”

Some of the programs implemented by Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation during 2017 were the exhibition of photographs of solidarity in 10 cities in Serbia with the support of the TANJUG news agency, a sightseeing tour "A Stroll through Belgrade of solidarity" with the support of Long Night of Museums, numerous workshops with young people, seniors and people with disabilities. Educational comic book poster "Small School of Solidarity" was designed and distributed in kindergartens and schools throughout the country. The project was implemented with the support of the European Union "Europe for Citizens" program, in cooperation with partner organizations from Poland, Hungary, Bulgaria, Macedonia and Albania.
